Unlock your vault with biometrics (4 min)

Biometrics aren't just for your phone. Use the password-free login feature to unlock Bitwarden on your desktop and browser, too! All you need is your face or fingerprint. Enable Unlock with Biometrics in a few minutes or less to save yourself more time later.

Enabling two-step login for your Bitwarden account (1 min 30 sec)

Two-step login, also called two-factor authentication (2FA), is the most important step to protect your online data (other than using a strong master password). In under two minutes, watch this easy-to-follow guide on two-step login.

How to use custom fields (2 min 30 sec)

Custom field types are a powerful feature for collecting and storing additional data, such as adding an SSH key to a login item in your vault or associating a business with a corporate credit card. Using custom fields, you can store up to 5,000 characters in any vault item type: Login, Card, Identity, or Secure Note.
