Export with attachments option now available

Bitwarden premium users can now [export vault data along with file attachments](#) using a new '.zip (With Attachments)' option. This update makes it easier to organize and move your data when needed. Not sure what to include as an attachment? Try adding a scanned passport to your Identity item for travel, saving health insurance cards with medical logins, or uploading insurance documents and emergency instructions to a Secure Note for your Emergency Contact to access, if they need them.
