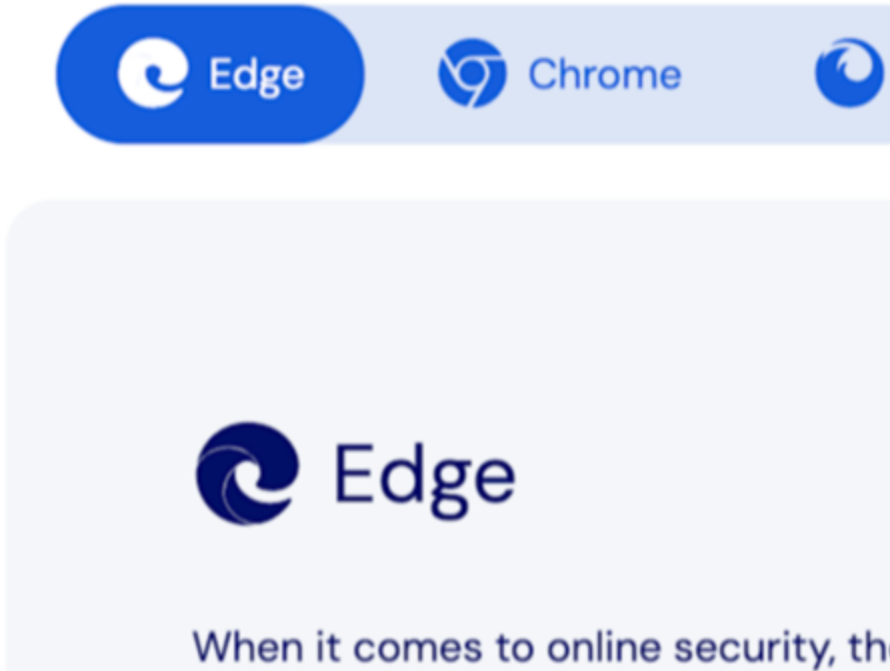

#1 Download the Bitwarden Edge browser extension.

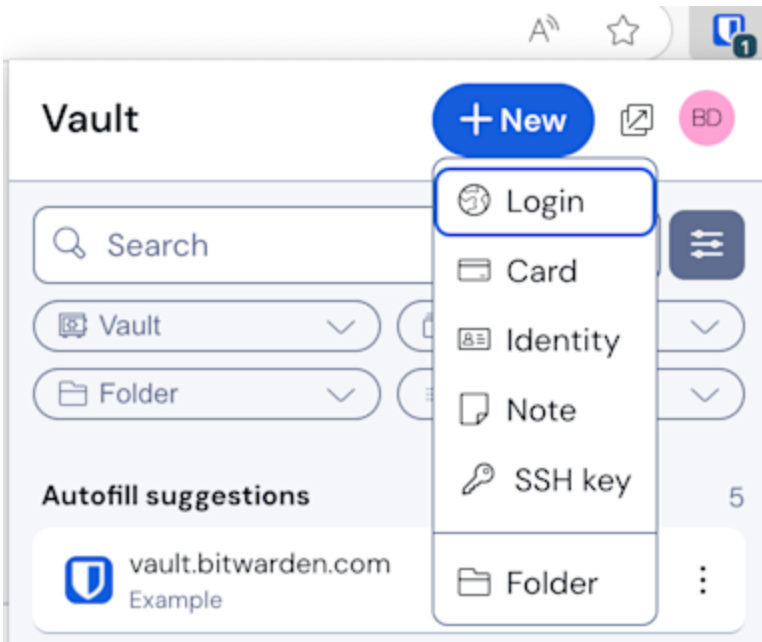
